It's a promise not to grasp the
little round sponge hanging by its
string, and besmirch your home-work,
done so neatly and well.

In a note Mr. Perkins would have his name omitted from the above. But is that consistent? He wants to know who wrote book-Slate!

Mr. Joseph H. Scranton has placed in our hands the book of records of the local political club which was organ ized November 17th, 1883, under the suggestive title "The Republican Phalanx," It is made up largely of a constitution and rules, and the lists of members. The engrossments are in the handwriting of Col. Chas. Scranton, who was, we presume, the leading spirit in the organization of the club, of which he was the President. The book is a substantial ledger, and in perfect condition and looks like it might have been used recently instead of 57 years ago. Doubtless, Mr. J. H. Scranton received it from his father and has kept it carefully as a treasure.

The constitution has a preface explaining the purpose of the organization which was to "Form an Association for more effectually carrying out the principles, and maintaining the sound financial, protective, moral and educational systems, which from time to time have been put forth and sustained by the great Republican party of the United States; under which systems our national government has made such triumphant progress during the past twenty years, and believing as we do that.in fostering and sustaining american industry before that of any other country, the mechanic, the laborer, the farmer; as well as trades men, and men of nearly every calling and occupation has his real and true interests largely benefitted, and thus the greatest good may be done to the greatest number." The rest of the preface deals with the details of the plan of organization. The constitution and rules are rather elaborate and substan-

There are some names we cannot decipher, and over 15 names signed by marks. Probably many signed to please the authorities, and later changed their political allegiance to other parties.

Now the last recorded initiation was on September 27th, 1884, which was probably the end of the Phalanx, for a few days later, Grover Cleveland was elected President over James G. Blaine, after perhaps the hottest presidential campaign in a century. No doubt it took the heart out of the young Rebublicans of the Club and they let it die, innocuos desuetude.
